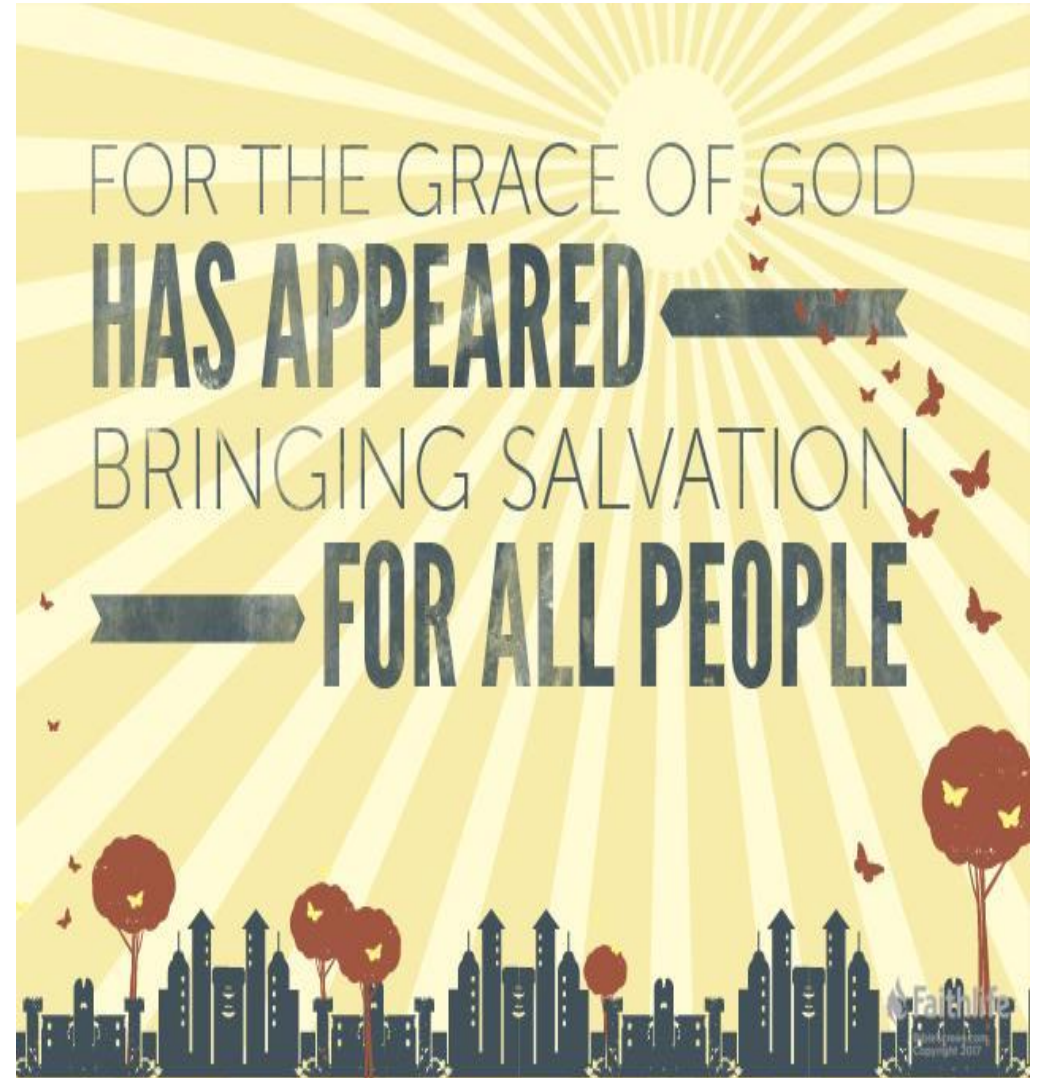

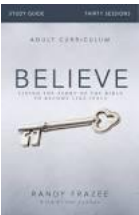

Dr. Rich Studebaker will present an original drama, “The Jesus Verdict,” at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday August 6 at Emmanuel Baptist Church. His solo drama ministry has taken him to churches, camps, and other settings in eleven states.
