

The Rescue Mission I directed in Clarksburg had two thrift stores. Like the Salvation Army and the ReStore, we received and resold items that were donated from the community. The stores needed to run well because they supplied a significant portion of our operating income. One day a lady came into the mission with her donated items. When I asked her why she didn't drop them off at one of the thrift stores, she said, "Well, I never know when your stores are open... you don't have any signs." I drove by our stores that day and found out she was right. So I bought two large signs that said, "Yes, We're Open!" and placed them in the store's main window. Donations and sales went up. Small changes can reap big benefits. As we come into the Fall at Emmanuel, I feel like I should buy the same sign for our church: "Yes, We're Open!" We are! People are returning to worship. Ministries and leadership meetings are returning. Bible studies and Life Groups are returning. We're back. We're open. God is good!

In August, my sermons will be looking at some lessons we can learn from living with Covid for a year. We can know the pandemic is behind us as we stop social distancing, take off our masks, stop hoarding, check our news feeds and we'll look at the vaccine as a spiritual symbol for protecting our hearts from negative outside influences. In September and October, we'll continue to look at Jesus' Sermon on the Mount as well as some messages from the Psalms and Prophets.

After eight years of positive family life ministry at Emmanuel, Jonathan and Maria Delgado have decided to move back to Atlanta, GA. Jonathan will be with us through the month of August. His last Sunday will be August 29. Pastor Jonathan will be preaching on Sunday, August 29 and then we'll have a Fellowship Lunch at noon in the Fellowship Hall to offer them our love, support and prayers as they move on in their ministry journey. The Delgados' have blessed Emmanuel in many ways for many years and I know they will be a blessing to the church they will serve in Atlanta in the days to come.

Ministry is back. Every Sunday, beginning in August, we will highlight a different church ministry. Our Adult Ministry team will be contacting every ministry in our church to schedule their Sunday to share.





From Pastor Jonathan (Family Life News)



Eight years ago, my family and I entered this church building for the first time. As first impressions go, Maria and I agree that we immediately felt welcomed and loved by the wonderful people of Emmanuel Baptist Church. We had just experienced a very difficult and emotional major life transition; leaving our church home in the Atlanta area where we had been serving for 9 years, saying farewell to family and close friends, and following God's leading as He called us to move north to West Virginia. The fact that our first EBC experience was one that was so filled with love and hospitality went a long way in assuring us that we had made the right decision and that this was where we belonged for the foreseeable future.

Over the next several years we experienced faith community like we had not experienced before! Emmanuel had brought me on staff as Family Life Minister to pour into the children, youth and families of the church; what I did not expect was how much the families of the church would pour into us as well! The church supported us and mourned with us when my older brother and Maria's

father passed away. You celebrated and rejoiced with us when I finally completed my MDiv Seminary education. You sent encouraging letters and prayers as we worked through Maria's health crisis and after every sermon I was blessed to preach among you. You embraced our daughters as though they were your own, and entrusted us to lead, teach and mentor your children in return. You spoke life and truth into our times of struggle and invited us to take part in yours as well, and together we grew in ways I would have never expected. We have truly made life-long friendships here that we know will carry through into God's eternal Kingdom.

Now, after having been loved and nurtured by Emmanuel for the last eight years, Maria and I believe we are being called back to our roots in Georgia to continue serving the Lord there and to carry back with us all the things we have learned from our time at EBC. This was not an easy decision to make, and we have been praying over it for close to two years. But God has made it clear to us that the next steps in our ministry journey are leading us back home to Atlanta. Saying "goodbye" to friends and loved ones has been even more difficult this time than it was when we left Georgia to come here; you are all so special to us and have been such a blessing to our family! But we take comfort, and pray you all will as well, in knowing that there are so many ways for us to maintain connection and community with our faith family at Emmanuel and that we have every intention of making frequent return visits to wild and wonderful West Virginia!

I am sure that in the days and weeks to come we will have opportunities to go into more detail about our plans, answer questions and share times of prayer together. I believe the children's and youth ministries are in great hands with our always-amazing volunteer teams; and through Pastor Kurt and Sarah Stephens' leadership, I know God will faithfully lead the church in the process to find the next minister who will be blessed enough to take over where I have left off.



Thank you, Emmanuel family, for loving Allee, Elena, Maria and I so well, and for providing us the opportunity to grow in our ministry and faith. You will always be in our hearts and in our prayers!

Summer is far from over, but our Newsletter is focusing on Fall activities and ministries starting back up. After more than a year of attending church, Bible study, Sunday school and yes, even counseling/therapy online or through Zoom, we are beginning to see one another face to face again.

I understand there is still an increase in cases in most states, but prayerfully those will be decreasing soon. I believe we yearn for "the way things used to be." Hugs to

greet one another or to show someone comfort cannot be a thing of the past. Studies show humans need 7 hugs a day to be emotionally healthy. We are on our way back to being a hugging people and society.



This Fall NEW LIFE COUNSELING CENTER is available to counsel those who continue to

struggle with pandemic fatigue, anxiety, and stress. These are real issues that many are struggling with each day. If you are uncertain whether you are among those affected, please stop by the office for a brief assessment.

September is also National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. Facts about suicide:

- 47.511 people lost their lives to suicide in 2019.
- 1 person dies by suicide every 11.1 minutes.
- There are 3.6x more male suicide deaths than female suicide deaths.
- 1.2 million attempted suicides in 2018.
- 135 people are affected by each suicide death.
- 40-50% of the population have been exposed to suicide in their lifetime.

Until Tim and I started attending Emmanuel, I had not heard of GRIEF SHARE. Many of my church family know that my beloved nephew Tyler completed suicide in July 2016, and we began attending Emmanuel in January 2017. Pastor Kurt knew I was a Professional Counselor and I think I began praying that I could/would plug my counseling vocation somehow into Emmanuel's ministries. In August, I began facilitating GRIEF SHARE. I was uncertain whether I was ready: had I dealt with my own grief since Tyler died? I did not know the answer to that but through much prayer and with faith in God, I facilitated my first session of GRIEF SHARE. It was a blessing to me and helped me begin my healing journey and I can only pray it was a blessing to others.

GRIEF SHARE is a 13-week Faith Based support/encouragement group for those who are grieving the death of a family member or friend. GRIEF SHARE is comprised of three components, viewing videos, group discussion and workbook reading and assignments. You will be encouraged throughout your journey from mourning to joy by others who are experiencing similar emotions and feelings.



Please join us if you have recently experienced the death of a family member or friend OR tell someone you know who might benefit from attending.
