




Ministry Updates and Opportunities "Showing Gratitude in the Midst of Change"



From Gail Samolitis (New Life Counseling Center)



Fall is my favorite time of year! I love the masterpiece of color and beauty the Master creates for us as the temperatures cool, the leaves turn to vibrant oranges, reds, yellows, and purples. The "Boys of Fall" will take the field as the fans fill the stadiums each week to cheer their favorite team. The baker in us all emerges to create delectable treats like Apple Cinnamon Walnut Muffins and Pumpkin Spice Cookies. The crisp, foggy mornings give way to crystal blue skies while the lights of evening come on just a little earlier each day. I am grateful for "All things Fall!"

The beginning of Fall is a reminder to me to be thankful to my Creator for ALL I have, especially during this challenging time of a pandemic. It is a time for me to take a moment and count my blessings, and to learn to be willing to share with others the bounty God has bestowed on me.



Fall is also the time of year to attend the American Association of Christian Counselors World Conference. It is a time to gain insights, receive education, and strengthen my therapeutic character through intensive, professional development. In September, Tim and I attended the American Association of Christian Counselors World Conference in Orlando, FL. We were joined by over 7,000 other professionals for this four-day learning event. Over 300 workshops were offered, ranging from loss and grief to COVID anxiety and addiction to digital devices and data.



The theme for this year's conference was Waymaker, meaning precursor or one that "goes before." During this time of pandemic, we are feeling an overwhelming burden of living, sometimes just opening our eyes in the morning or taking a breath seems like too much. Christ is THE Waymaker, the ONE that goes before me, before us. I was relieved to hear from the speakers, throughout our four days, that we are not alone on this post pandemic path. It is God the Father, Jesus Christ the Son and the Holy Spirit who are with us. We walk daily through this pandemic, but He is on this path with us, for us. No, life doesn't get easier when we profess Christ. But we come to realize and rely upon the fact (the fact, not

the feeling) that Christ is with us. Though there have been many days of isolation, sheltering in place and quarantine have faith in knowing God's character and who He is. "The LORD himself goes before you...." (Deut. 31:8)

I was able to find meaning through attending workshops, discussing current topics and events and sharing thoughts and ideas with other Christian counselors and community leaders. It is refreshing to realize that I am not the only one serving clients in this capacity because many days the pathway does feel dark and lonely. The AACC also serves to boost counselor morale through guest speakers like Dr. Ben Carson, Darryl Strawberry, Lysa TerKeurst and Lt General Gerry Boykin (ret) and Christian musicians like Danny Gokey and Jeremy Camp and Christian comedian Ted Cunningham.





I will incorporate all I have learned and experienced during this 2021 AACC conference into Grief Share, New Life Counseling and to all I am honored and privileged to serve. I am grateful to be a Christian Counselor and believe God called me to do so very early in life.


Cards for Pam McClain

A Review of our Praises from August & September (Contd.):



The time of increased solitude has given us time to deepen our relationships with loved ones and better appreciate when our health is good! The circumstances have also affected the missionaries we support. For example, Madeline Flores had time to strengthen relationships with the people she serves locally. The Gutierrez in S. Africa used the time

to learn how to make health education animated videos. These videos are easily translated into other languages and disseminated in the community. We have been able to continue many of our Emmanuel mission activities as well, such as our collection for the Mountain State Missions, a visit from the new WV AWANA Missionary Gary Wood, and continuing the - well attended - Monday night Bible Study at Harmony Ridge Recovery Center!

The "Ministry Development" part of our team has also remained active.
