

Summer's Hope from Pastor Kurt

In our Tuesday and Wednesday Bible Studies we've been studying 1 Peter. Recently we looked at a familiar passage in 1 Peter 3: 15-16: "... in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander."



The nice thing about the summer months is that the warmer weather encourages us to get up and get out more. As we socialize and interact with more people, we have more opportunities to share our faith in Jesus. The passage tells us the first key to being an effective witness is to put Jesus at the center of your life. He is not just the Savior that rescued us, but our Lord who guides us. With Jesus guiding us each day, we can look for opportunities where people talk about their struggles and problems. They may ask you how you deal with life and process your problems: "How do you have hope when everything seems so hopeless?" Pray for

Jesus is our hope and our life. Our church is a fellowship of caring people who are focused on sharing the love of Jesus with others. Be gentle because people have been hurt by other Christians and by church fights and they may lash out in anger at any talk of "organized religion." Be respectful of their opinions and be mindful of their life story and spiritual journey; it is probably very different from your own. If you are able to share your hope with someone this summer, pass along your story to Pastor Kurt or to your friends at Emmanuel. Your faithfulness to share your faith will be an encouragement to others.



Baptism Reflections...

When people get baptized at Emmanuel, I ask them to fill out a worksheet that asks them some simple questions: How did you become a Christian? What does baptism mean? Why are you getting baptized? and What is a Bible verse or story that you like? Here are some baptism reflections from some people who have been baptized over the last year:



Tabitha Powell wrote this on her baptism worksheet: "I know I'm a Christian because at a very low point in my life when I almost gave up faith, **God sent me a friend**. She not only saved my life, she asked me to come with her to church and she continued to support me through everything. She also told me that God sent her to me to help me. From that day on I knew God was real and he was going to always be there. **Being a Christian to me means believing that there is someone greater than all of us...** I am being baptized because of my commitment to follow Jesus. One of my favorite Bible stories is where Peter raised Tabitha from the dead in **Acts 9.**

Margie Edwards wrote on her baptism worksheet: "I am so thankful that God has been blessing me all my life. I was raised by loving Christian parents and can't ever remember not knowing that Jesus loves us and came to be our Savior. I know that Jesus died for our sin, was buried and rose from the grave. I grew up in church, asked Jesus to forgive my sins and was baptized by sprinkling when I was 12 years old.... I am being baptized by immersion because Jesus told His followers to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded." A Bible



verse or Bible story I like is **Joshua 1:9,** "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Evan Bevins wrote this on his baptism worksheet:

"I was always raised in the church and don't have a clear conversion moment. But as I learned from my family and church about the love and nature of God, I came to understand that there was nothing I could do to justify myself or earn salvation. I was at times worried that things I had done would keep me out of Heaven. At some point, the words of **Psalm 51:17** struck me: "My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise." I understood I couldn't earn **God's forgiveness and love**, but that He offered them all the same, through the death and resurrection of his son, Jesus.... I am being baptized because as an **act of obedience** based on Jesus' words in **Matthew 28:16-20**. Jesus told his disciples to go and make disciples of all



nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.... Raised in the Methodist tradition, I was baptized as a child and confirmed in adolescence. Although a church I attended offered immersion as a way of remembering your baptism and experiencing it as Jesus did, I never took advantage of that. I struggled with this at one point as I would like to join the church but didn't want to just go through the motions with that as my primary motivator. Understanding that it is not a requirement of salvation but appreciating what it means as a witness and **symbol of my commitment**, and yes, wanting to join the church, I feel comfortable doing this now. (That may not be the best way to say it, I don't feel like I am doing it to check a box, but as a sincere symbol of my love for Jesus.... A Bible verse or a Bible story I like is: **Psalm 51:16-17**, 'You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise."



Now that the weather is finally warmer, one of my morning routines is to sit on the steps in our foyer after I've fed our "critters" (deer in the back yard and birds and squirrels in the front yard). I bring along a cup of coffee and my Bible, devotional books, and any study guides I might be using at the time. After I pray, **I simply enjoy God's creation** and wait for the **Holy Spirit** to speak to me through my furry and feathered friends.



While waiting on inspiration for this article, I remembered that in Sunday School and Junior Church we're learning about **God's Family**. I see the various personalities of the yard critters reflected in our kids at Emmanuel and the broader EBC family. Some of them (cardinals, sparrows, starlings), like some church members and children, are faithful to show up regularly, even at the same time! Some (red bellied woodpeckers, nuthatches, titmice, pigeons, and doves) are regular visitors, but from time to time I might not see them. I get excited when I see a downy woodpecker land on the side of our tree or when a doe brings her fawn(s) to the back yard for the first time, just as I do when

we have a child in junior church whom we haven't seen for some time or when we have a visitor. And just like our **online church family**, there are the vireos and eastern woodpeewees, who don't actually visit the feeder, but I know they're there because they identify themselves by their call, just as our **Facebook** audience will greet fellow worshippers in the broadcast comment section.

Some of my critters are passive, some are loud and rambunctious, and some are a little crazy and messy – especially the squirrels! Some are "prettier" than others, just like humans, but they're all part of my critter "family", and I take great joy in feeding them and providing for them, just as **our Heavenly Father takes great joy in feeding us** both literally and spiritually because we're a part of His family.

Our Emmanuel family has been so supportive of our children's ministry, and for that I am so grateful. Several of our children and youth will be attending **Camp Cowen**, including some of our second graders! What a wonderful opportunity for them to experience Camp Cowen at such an early age. And as of this writing, at least three of our EBC family (**Dee & Brian Lallemont and John Nicholson**) have volunteered to be counselors at the Younger Midler Camp, so our second graders will see some familiar faces at their very first camp! **God bless our volunteer counselors as well as those of you who so generously donated to the Cowen Scholarship fund.**

From the Organ Bench - David Enoch

"All Things Bright and Beautiful" by Cecil F. Alexander

Excerpt from the book "Then Sings my Soul Book 2" by Robert J. Morgan $\,$



"Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good." ~ Genesis 1:31 (NKJV)

"One day, Mrs. Cecil Frances Alexander was working with one of her pupils in Sunday school— a little boy who happened to be her godson. He was struggling to understand the Apostles' Creed and certain portions of the catechism. Mrs. Alexander began to mull the

possibility of converting the Apostles' Creed into songs for children, using simple little hymns to explain the phrases and truths of he Christian faith to the little ones.

The Apostles' Creed begins: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord. For the phrase, "Maker of heaven and earth..." she wrote this lovely little song, "All Things Bright and Beautiful." She based the hymn on Genesis 1:31: "The God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good."



These hymns were published in 1848 in Mrs. Alexender's book, *Hymns for Little Children*. It became one of the most successful hymn-publishing projects in history, going through over one hundred editions. She published many other books and hymnals, but nothing has stood the test of time like the powerful combination of the Apostles' Creed with her own gift for song."
