



# Ministry Updates & Reflections from Pastor Kurt



On Sunday, August 24, Emmanuel will host our Annual Ministry Fair. Various ministries in the church will create a brief video overview of their ministry and then be available in the Fellowship Hall to answer questions. You are encouraged to make your way to the Fellowship Hall on this Sunday so you can see, hear and learn about the variety of gifts and ministries that are active at Emmanuel. We ask you to pray for each ministry and to also pray that God might direct you to get involved in a ministry that matches your gifts. There will be a light lunch offered August 24th at noon so people can enjoy food and fellowship and the ministry fair. We will also create a Ministry Fair brochure with a summary of the video ministry overviews.

In 1 Corinthains 12 Paul uses the image of the body to help people understand how God works in a church. He says in v. 18: "God has arranged the parts of the body, everyone of them, just as he wants them to be." In vv. 26-27 he says, "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." Paul shares a similar thought about the church in Romans 12:4-6 where he says, "Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given us." Peter shares Paul's view of the church when he says in 1 Peter 4: 10, "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms."



Emmanuel's vision statement is that God has called us to "offer LIFE to the world." LIFE is found as: We Love God with all our heart. We Include others who feel alone. We Find Connection through Fellowship Groups and Ministries where we can learn and grow. And LIFE grows as Engage Community by using our gifts to God's glory. Where has God gifted you? Are you willing to get involved?



William Barclay shares this simple poem in his commentary on 1 Corinthains:

"God has no hands but our hands, to do his work today.

He has no feet but our feet, to lead people in his way.

He had no voice but our voice, to tell people why he died;

He has no help, but our help to lead people to his side."




In John 6, we are told that the feeding of the 5000 was preceded by a boy who offered his bag lunch to Jesus. John 6:8 says, "Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, "Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" Jesus took the boys small lunch and multiplied it to feed over 5000. The simple lesson in this story is this: Anything we give fully to Jesus, no matter how small, he will take and use it and expand it's impact on others. God, help us to be like the boy who gave Jesus his bag lunch.

Years ago someone gave me this simple summary of the motive for Christian service:

"I am only one; but I am one. I cannot do everything. But I can do something. What I can do, I ought to do; And what I ought to do, by the grace of God, I will do."

In August, our Tuesday and Wednesday Bible studies will be using the The Prodigal God video series by Tim Keller. Here's a summary of this six week study: Two sons, one kept the rules religiously and one who broke them all. One father who loved both lost sons beyond anything they could imagine. Discover the amazing depths of God's extravagant love. In six captivating sessions, Pastor and New York Times bestselling author, Timothy Keller opens your eyes to the powerful message of Jesus' best known and least understood parable: The Prodigal Son. The six sessions will cover the following: The Parable. The People around Jesus. The Two Lost Sons. The Elder Brother. The True Elder Brother. The Feast of the Father.

It is August! In a matter of days many area schools began fall classes. Parents will be scheduling <u>one last weekend</u> at the mountain cabin or lake shore to eek out the final drops of summer fun <u>before the weather turns crisp and cool</u> and the days become shorter. With this seasonal shift comes the **start of our fall ministries** too!

After our summer hiatus, **GRIEF SHARE** will begin on **WEDNESDAY AUGUST 13, 2025, at 6:00 p.m.** GriefShare is a <u>faith-based support group</u> of loving, caring people who will come alongside you during one of life's most difficult journeys. <u>You do not have to go through the grief process alone</u>. **GriefShare is open to the community**, so if you have lost a loved one or close friend to death or know someone who has, I invite you to join us.



This 13-week support group meets at Emmanuel Baptist Church usually on Wednesday evenings. The support group consists of three components: videos, small group discussion, and workbook assignments. Sessions are informal and participants are never forced to share their story during the small group discussions. Videos are a minute long and provide topics for those small group discussions. EBC has purchased the Grief Share workbook which each participant receives to take home. There are many pages of helpful experiences, prayers, and encouragement to assist participants during the week and beyond.



Also, after our regular session of Grief Share, Emmanuel will host a SURVIVING THE HOLIDAYS seminar on Saturday, November 8th at 10 a.m. This seminar will close our GRIEF SHARE cycle for the winter, but we will resume again on February 7, 2026 with a LOSS OF SPOUSE seminar.



# From the Organ Bench - David Enoch

"Oh How I Love Jesus" by Frederick Whitfield

Excerpt from the book "Then Sings my Soul Book 2" by Robert J. Morgan

"We Love Him because He first loved us." ~ 1 John 4:19 (NKJV)

"Frederick Whitfield devoted his life to pastoral ministry in the Church of England. His greatest legacy is this hymn about the name of Jesus, written when he was a student. While Whitfield wrote the verses to this hymn, he didn't compose it's famous chorus.




Both the simple words and the nimble tune of 'O How I Love Jesus' are American inventions of unknown origin. They floated around like orphans, attaching themselves to various hymns in the nineteenth century. One hymnologist found forty-two occurrences of this chorus in early songbooks.

When "O How I Love Jesus" was finally wedded to Whitfield's "There Is a Name I Love to Hear," it was a marriage made in heaven. We've been singing it ever since. Some of Whitfield's original verses have fallen by the wayside, which is too bad; every verse tells us what the Name of Jesus can do in our lives."

# **Updates From our Staff:**

#### From Edy Jones - Necessity Closet



At your Necessity Closet we are putting **LOVE** to work for folks facing difficulty making ends meet. We are doing something that may seem small to us and yet can be a BIG something for the person who receives our time, prayers and necessity items.

**Each month on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays**, we open our 23rd St. door and welcome anyone in our community that needs personal hygiene and household products they otherwise would not be able to afford. Not only do they receive the products that we offer but **many receive words of care, encouragement and prayer**.



To cite an example, we had a lady this past week who comes by on a regular basis (which is every other month, 6 times per year). This lady has been a **caregiver for her husband** who had cancer for a couple of years and more than once we have **prayed for this difficult situation**. I always try to pass along helpful information, but a couple of months ago she came in and was **extremely anxious and overwhelmed**. I felt really sorry for her as she too suffered watching her loved one slowly go through the dying process. Thankfully, they **both know Jesus as Savior** and Lord, but....**being a caregiver is HARD** and I so wanted to be able to help her. In the time that passed, I continued to think of her often and **prayed about her situation** until she finally came back in and although her situation had not changed, she was handling it better. Then this past Tuesday she came in and told me that her dear husband had passed away. She is grieving but knows he is now in heaven and has no more pain. I was able to share with her about our Grief Share program and that when she was ready that would be a good place to begin.

I want to thank the church family for making all this possible. We are grateful for the volunteers, monetary and in-kind donations each month. As Hebrews 13:16 says, "do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God." So, thank you for your sacrifices!
