#### JUDY PRATER: A TRIBUTE TO SERVICE & LEADERSHIP!

My husband, Gary, and I came to Emmanuel Baptist Church in 1973 when Dr. John Keck served as minister and Hal Parker taught Sunday School. Gary and I were expecting Jason and we

wanted to bring him up in a Christian home, so, we joined the church, Chancel Choir, and the Crusaders Class, where we found community, support, and Christian love.

Years later, in 1983, when our children, Jason and Michael were 9 and 7, our choir needed a director, and I felt called to help out on an interim basis. I was learning how to conduct a choir by practicing on our teens, and with the patient guidance of skilled pianists and organist, David Nuss and Scott Hobson, I bluffed my conducting until I figured it out!

During that time as conductor, Dr. John Keck gave me complete freedom to develop a music ministry according to the Holy Sprit's leading. I remember in those early years, Emmanuel Baptist hosted the Annual Meeting of the WV Baptist Convention and the EBC Chancel Choir was the Convention Choir. That experience opened up many opportunities for me to lead the singing at state events, including events for American Baptist Women.

It's hard to put into words the feeling that I get when leading God's people in song. I believe I serve as a conduit, connecting the worshippers together into one great voice praising and communing with their God. I feel as though I am the humble and thrilled conductor.

What a great experience it was to work with talented and dedicated accompanists. I was able to work with: Brian VanNoy, Kathy Dowler, Jan Corrothers, and Abby Woods Haake who were all high school students, but had already immeasurable skills above me. God knew

what I needed and He sent those talented and dedicated young people to me.

And just as God sent those to help me, we, as a collective Music Ministry, were able to help others. We were blessed by assisting Kathy Harrison, Courtney Jones, and Dan Hylbert who had impairments with lack of mobility, breathing, hearing, blindness. What a privilege to have been able to provide an opportunity for all God's children to praise Him in song.

We had faithful choir members who showed up week in and week out. Whether they were full of energy or exhausted, they considered singing in the choir their gift to the Lord. Several of them are still singing in the choir today under Donna's inspiring leadership.

Not only was I privileged to work with the excellent musicians that I have mentioned already, but I also found friendships which have made a powerful impact on my life. Candy Lindstrom & Chris Redmond. Donna Marcinko & Dave Enoch. Bill Thomas & Jan Corrothers, Gerald Morgan, and of course, Kurt Busiek. Can you imagine the gift that each one of these people have been in my life? It's indescribable!

I'm so grateful for the huge opportunities that my beloved church has given me. The limitless love and support, encouragement and approval to initiate some wild and crazy programs, approving many trips to the church music conference at Green Lake, WI, where I would come back with knowledge and inspiration and unusual ideas such as a Colonial Williamsburg Christmas celebration.

Undoubtedly, God led me to Emmanuel, and God led us to each other. I have come to love my church, and love each of you, and I will take many memories with me to Greensburg. I may find another church home, but I will never be able to find another church that is more of a family than our precious EBC. May we never take us for granted. Thank you, Lord.

Eric and Yuree Lembke serve at the Kawthoolei Karen Baptist Bible School and College (KKBBSC) located in Mae La Refugee Camp near Mae Sot, Thailand. Young adults, mainly from the Karen ethnic group, attend the school to pursue a degree in ministry to serve as Christian leaders within the refugee camps and to internally displaced persons in the areas along the Thai/Myanmar border. Eric and Yuree's ministry focuses on working with refugees through education, discipleship and evangelism. At the school, they teach English and ministry classes. They also travel with KKBBSC students and staff to villages in Karen State, Myanmar, to teach and conduct Bible classes.
