

#### 3 / 65: GOSPEL, GRACE, & GRATITUDE Pastor Kurt



Blaine Hess is part of our church search team. They are in the process of developing a church profile that can be presented to potential candidates that gives an overview of our church history, ministry and mission. One comment he made recently stuck with me. He said, "Emmanuel is unique in that it has had only three pastors in 65 years." When the average time a pastor stays at a church in America is only 3-4 years, Emmanuel is different. Dr. John Keck was at Emmanuel for 25 years. Dr. Bill Thomas was at Emmanuel for 13 years, and 2026 will make my 25<sup>th</sup> year at Emmanuel; add 2 years of interim pastors and you get 65. I think there are three qualities that have been part of these long pastorates that have become part of the church's identity: gospel, grace and gratitude.

Emmanuel is a church where the Bible is held up as the inspired word of God and the simple gospel has been shared faithfully by our pastors and leaders over the years. The gospel is found in **John 3:16-17**, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." May God continue to use us to share the gospel with the world.



Emmanuel is a church where grace is shared and lived out. I know this from personal experience.

I came to Emmanuel at a low time in my life and have struggled at various times over the years; and my family has had some struggles that have played out in the public life of our church. Emmanuel shared grace with me and my family. You came alongside us when you could have stood over us in judgement. When other churches might have been calling a meeting to discuss

the "problem," Emmanuel showed me and my family love and extended grace. Grace is central to the gospel and a key to living out our faith. Paul in **Philippians 2:3-4** gives a good summary of how grace can be lived out: "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."



Emmanuel is a church where gratitude is part of our DNA. Every week, we list praises on our prayer page. These praises are an expression of gratitude for people and ministry events that have blessed our church and community. In our Newsletter, we collect and share two months worth of praises from the life of our church. These are print heavy, single-spaced pages, but take some time to read this praise list; it's a practical way we express gratitude.

Russel Moore just did a podcast called "30 things I've learned in 30 years of ministry." One of his suggestions was: Save the thank you notes you've received; there will be down days when you'll need to re-read them. I have boxes, not files, but boxes of thank you notes from various people over my 40 years of ministry... it's always good to take some time to read where God used your life and words to help someone. This is an area where I think you reap what you sow. I have made it a priority in my ministry to send notes of gratitude to anyone that the Lord brings to my mind who is using their gift to bring God glory at Emmanuel. These notes are short

expressions of gratitude but I think God has used them to make gratitude a central part of our church life and fellowship.

Three pastors in 65 years; that is unique, but what is more important is what these pastors have shared that has become a part of Emmanuel's ministry identity: gospel, grace and gratitude. Paul provides a helpful challenge: "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18.

Years ago, as **Debby Jamison** was dying of pancreatic cancer, she took some time to write down what she called "**My Litany of Thanksgiving**." It's a simple, but powerful expression of gratitude during a difficult time in her life:

"For wonderful, ordinary parents who knew the difference between right and wrong and taught their children its values: I thank you, Lord.

For being in love and having that love returned: I thank you, Lord.

For children: I thank you, Lord.

For being a member of a wonderful family: I thank you, Lord.

For all my friends: I thank you, Lord.

For the privilege and freedom of living in a great country: I thank you, Lord.

For my church and faith: I thank you, Lord.

For creating me and giving me eternal life: I thank you, Lord."

#### Why gratitude & grief can, and do coexist!



The holiday season with its messages of **thankfulness** and **joy** is quickly approaching. This is an especially difficult time for those who are in a season of grief. The world tells us to "count our blessings" but when our heart is aching from loss that message can feel more like a burden than a comfort. How can we possibly be grateful when we feel so broken?

God's Word does not ask us to be thankful for our grief, but to be **thankful in all circumstances** (1 Thessalonians 5:18). This is not a command to deny our pain but rather an **invitation to hold our grief in one hand** and our **gratitude in the other**, trusting that **God is present** in both.

<u>Grief Share offers a path forward</u>. This 13- week program offers a safe, welcoming, Christ centered space to navigate the journey of grief with others who understand. If you have experienced the death of a loved one, you are not alone.



Through weekly videos, small group discussion, and a personal workbook, Grief Share provides a supportive community where you can process your emotions honestly while rediscovering hope.



After our regular fall session of Grief Share, Emmanuel will host a SURVIVING THE HOLIDAYS seminar on Saturday, November 8th at 10 a.m. This seminar will close our GRIEF SHARE cycle for the winter, but we will resume again on February 7, 2026 with a LOSS OF SPOUSE seminar. Our next Grief Share group will begin on Wednesday, February 11, 2026 at 6:00 p.m.



#### **Gratitude Reminder**



Talk to nearly anyone today who has any sort of opinion about church music and they'll tell you that the organist is a rare asset.



A church organist's role is to provide skilled musical

accompaniment that <u>enhances the worship experience</u> and helps the congregation <u>connect with their faith</u>. By supporting hymns, choirs, and soloists, they use their musical talent and knowledge of Christian tradition to create a prayerful and reflective atmosphere. By **skillfully using the organ's pedals and stops**, the organist provides a **strong, warm, and confident sound** that supports the entire congregation's singing. Music is a powerful tool for expressing emotion in worship, ranging from joyous celebration to somber contemplation. The organist draws upon this emotional aspect of music to help worshippers connect more deeply with the message of the service.

We will look forward to talking with Judy, moving forward, and we will anticipate seeing her again! We love You Judy!





I have learned so much about people and compassion since I began volunteering for the necessity closet. I expected to "give" to people but I didn't realize how much I would "receive" from them.
